

What is Alpha?

The Alpha Course is open to everyone interested in exploring the meaning of life and discovering the relevance of the Christian faith.

We share a simple meal together at the beginning of each session - which gives us an opportunity to get to know each other - followed by a video talk leading into small group discussions.

The Alpha course spread during the 1990s, initially in the UK and then internationally, as more and more people found it a helpful and informal way to discuss questions about the Christian faith.

There are now over 55,000 Alpha courses worldwide in 166 countries, run in 75 languages. Today, more than 17 million people have participated in the Alpha Course.

Alpha is supported by all the major Christian denominations.
