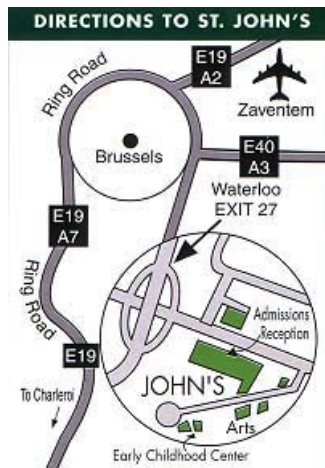

How to get there?

St. John's International School is located in a quiet, tree-lined, residential area of Waterloo, Belgium.

St. John's is situated just 20 minutes from Brussels, the capital of Belgium and headquarters of the European Union.

St. John's is easily accessible just moments off the Ring Road Highway. Whether you are driving from the North or South, follow Ring 0 (a beltway around Brussels) and take exit 27 (Argenteuil); at the bottom of the ramp, turn left if you are coming from the North, turn right if you are coming from the South. The school is located 100 meters on your right-hand side.
